**Bibb County School District
Adopts Unified Elementary School Bell Times**

In its effort to develop an efficient and effective school bus routing system, the Board of Education voted to adopt a unified bell for elementary schools.

This new bell schedule will give bus drivers ample time to deliver elementary students to their schools in time for breakfast after completing their high school and middle school routes. This will also free up resources at the schools so that they can help address overcrowding issues in some areas.

Beginning with the 2009-2010 school year, the Bibb County School District will have the following bell times:
